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BIP Components Checklist

- Student demographic information
- Target behavior operational definition
- Baseline data summary
- Hypothesis/function statement
- Replacement behavior identified
- Antecedent strategies
- Teaching strategies
- Consequence strategies
- Data collection plan
- Crisis/safety plan (if needed)

Hypothesis Statement Template

When [antecedent], [student] engages in [behavior] in order to [function: obtain/avoid] [outcome].

Function-Based Interventions

For Attention-Maintained Behavior

- Increase positive attention for appropriate behavior
- Teach appropriate attention-seeking
- Minimize attention for problem behavior

For Escape-Maintained Behavior

- Modify task difficulty/length
- Teach request for break
- Build skills to complete tasks

For Tangible-Maintained Behavior

- Teach appropriate requesting
- Create earning systems
- Increase access contingent on behavior

For Sensory-Maintained Behavior

- Provide appropriate sensory alternatives
- Modify environment
- Teach self-regulation strategies

Replacement Behavior Criteria

- Serves same function as problem behavior
- More efficient (faster, easier)
- More effective (works more reliably)

- Socially acceptable
- Within student's skill set
